The Theatre Program o ers a Bachelor of Arts in Theatre that produces graduates who are prepared to enter M.F.A. or M.A. programs in theatre to enter the job market for actors and technicians for theatrical productions, or creatively market their variety of theatre skills for use in non-theatrical venues such as law, training, sales, promotion, marketing and other types of presentation activities.

These goals are accomplished through a combination of theoretical classroom explorations and practical production of plays.
